# MILESTONES

- SEPTEMBER 4, 1904** The late Dr. Henry W. Frauenthal established a clinic at Lexington Avenue and Fiftieth Street for the study and treatment of orthopaedic conditions. This clinic marked the beginning of the hospital idea.
- OCTOBER 11, 1905** The Hospital was incorporated and chartered by the State Department of Charities, now the Department of Social Welfare, as The Jewish Hospital for Deformities and Joint Diseases.
- NOVEMBER 4, 1906** The Hospital was opened. Its first home was on the present site in one remodeled brownstone house, 1917 Madison Avenue. Capacity—7 beds and dispensary facilities.
- NOVEMBER 19, 1906** First organization meeting of the Ladies' Auxiliary.
- APRIL 7, 1907** Name changed by Board of Directors to Hospital for Deformities and Joint Diseases. Approved by an order of Supreme Court of State of New York on October 30, 1908.
- MARCH 1, 1908** Began to share in the funds of the United Hospital Fund, then known as the Hospital Saturday and Sunday Association.
- JANUARY 1, 1910** Three brownstone houses on Madison Avenue internally connected and externally joined by open porches constituted the Hospital of 56 beds and Dispensary.
- NOVEMBER 4, 1913** The cornerstone was laid for an Out-Patient building at 41 East 123rd Street.
- NOVEMBER 3, 1914** The six-story Out-Patient building was dedicated and occupied. The removal of the dispensary facilities to new quarters immediately permitted the bed capacity to increase to 105 beds.
- JANUARY 1, 1917** Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies was organized, and the Hospital was admitted to membership.
- NOVEMBER 14, 1920** Name changed to Hospital For Joint Diseases. Filed and recorded on November 23, 1920.
- JANUARY 1, 1922** Demolition of all old buildings on Madison Avenue front, making way for the new main hospital building.
- MAY 6, 1923** Cornerstone was laid of the present main Hospital and Nurses' Residence buildings.
- OCTOBER 5, 1924** New Hospital building dedicated and two days later patients admitted.
- NOVEMBER 1, 1924** Establishment of Social Service Department.
- DECEMBER 1, 1925** Mr. Alfred M. Heinsheimer established the Natalie and Louis Heinsheimer Memorial by donating to the Hospital his magnificent estate at Far Rockaway, and by creating a trust fund for its maintenance. The buildings were converted for hospital use and on May 16, 1926, they were dedicated. On June 25, 1926, the Country Home was opened for patients and was occupied for 27 years until July 31, 1953 when it was closed.
- MARCH 11, 1927** Dr. Henry W. Frauenthal, the founder of the Hospital, died. His monument is the Hospital he founded.
- JULY 1, 1927** The Henry W. Frauenthal Travel Scholarship was established for special studies in the leading clinics and laboratories of this country and Europe.
- OCTOBER 7, 1930** The Walter M. Brickner Memorial Lecture was established for the purpose of deepening interest in the sciences of medicine and surgery.

The Sir Robert Jones Lecture was established—its object being the diffusing of knowledge in orthopaedic surgery.

**JUNE 6, 1938** The cornerstone was laid for the new Out-Patient building—45 to 55 East 123rd Street, extending through to East 124th Street.

**FEBRUARY 7, 1939** The new Out-Patient building was opened for the reception of patients.

**NOVEMBER 23, 1939** The new Out-Patient building was officially dedicated as the Leo L. Doblin Memorial in grateful recognition of Mr. Doblin's generosity and devotion to the Hospital.

**OCTOBER 9, 1941** The Social Service Board and the Ladies Auxiliary Board were merged into one Women's Division.

**FEBRUARY 7, 1942** The Melanie Faith Polachek Cournard Memorial (Professional Services Building) was dedicated in loving memory of the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Polachek. The modernization and equipment of the old Out-Patient building were made possible by a generous gift from Mr. John Polachek and by contributions from Trustees and friends of the Hospital.

**OCTOBER 15, 1945** The School of Practical Nursing was officially established, providing an approved one-year course of training for practical nurses, and the first class was admitted.

**APRIL 16, 1950** The cornerstone was laid for the Lila Motley Radiation Therapy Department Annex, a two-story and basement building on East 123rd Street.

**DECEMBER 3, 1950** The new Annex, made possible by a generous gift from the Lila Motley League, Inc., and by contributions from Trustees and friends of the Hospital was dedicated. It houses the Lila Motley Radiation Therapy Department with its 2 million volt x-ray therapy machine, the William Blau Lecture Hall, and the offices of the Women's Division.

**SEPTEMBER 6, 1955** The Helene Fuld School of Practical Nursing was officially opened and all school activities were transferred to this new building, made possible by a munificent gift from the Helene Fuld Foundation.

**OCTOBER 1, 1956** Designation of the main hospital building as The Frederick Brown Pavilion in recognition of Mr. Brown's outstanding service and generosity to the Hospital.

Opening of the new patient floors, indicating the completion of the two-year building construction program which modernized, improved and increased the physical facilities of every section of the institution.

The Hospital plant now includes: (1) the eight-story Main Hospital Building occupying a block front on Madison Avenue from East 123rd Street to East 124th Street opposite Mount Morris Park; (2) The six-story Nurses Residence Building on the East 124th Street side; (3) the eight-story Professional Services Building; (4) the eight-story Out-Patient Building; (5) the two-story Radiation Therapy Building on the East 123rd Street side; and (6) the School of Practical Nursing on the corner of Madison Avenue and East 119th Street.

**NOVEMBER 4, 1956** The Hospital marks the fiftieth anniversary of its opening at its present site.

## REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT FOR THE YEAR 1956

THIS IS THE FIFTH TIME I have had the privilege of reporting to you about the condition of the Hospital. For the most part I shall omit the recital of numerical accomplishments since they are fully covered in the yearly report of the Hospital. Moreover, the concentration of detail sometimes results in obscuring the outlines of the forest in describing the trees of which it is composed.

I feel called upon to make a report to you of the five years of my tenure for obvious reasons, as a steward of your powers and responsibilities, but even more emphatically because this period has been one of decision and transition.

Certain hesitations having to do with our location, our status as a specializing hospital with collateral services and our physical independence were ended. Although they were the expression of what seemed to many to be pertinent considerations, they served to frustrate active attitudes and development, to deprive the Hospital of the opportunity to realize its potentialities. The process of realization has by no means been completed—in fact it has barely begun. Steps have been taken and advances made which have increased our stature in many ways and I believe they are of a permanent nature regardless of which direction we may look to in the future.

The fulfillment of our building program was more or less coincident with the celebration of our Fiftieth Anniversary. Almost every physical feature of the Hospital has been renovated and modernized. There remains to be done only the moving and modernization of the X-ray Department, which should be completed in late Spring. We have produced, I believe, a first rate hospital at a cost of about \$2,500,000. It is probable that its equivalent in terms of new construction would have required an expenditure of some \$10,000,000. While it is true that we do not have a new building, I can think of no important respects in which our services, insofar as they are based on physical equipment, are noticeably inferior to what would be expected in brand new facilities.

A modest amount of new space was provided—for instance our bed capacity was increased from 280 to 305. The greatest amount of money by far was spent on the renovation of old facilities and on new equipment. There are now operating rooms, laboratories, office, heating equipment, floors re-

built and refurbished, and, in general, a rebuilding or renovation of almost all of the bed facilities in the hospital—private, semi-private and ward.

A very substantial part of the money necessary for the building program came from the bequest of Mrs. H. Sylvia A. H. G. Wilks. A major share was furnished by the Building Fund Campaign of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies. We were the beneficiaries, with hospitals throughout the country, of a grant from the Ford Foundation. The site as well as the major portion of the funds for our newly built School of Practical Nursing was given by the Helene Fuld Foundation. And, of course, there were a multitude of other contributions to our building fund, for all of which we are most grateful.

It would be difficult to over-estimate the contribution to the quality and economy of our building program of Mr. Sydney Goldstone, who, as head of the Building Committee, supervised the program with meticulous and devoted care. Throughout the entire construction program, with all its attendant problems, the services to our patients were carried on to the fullest extent and without loss of patient income. We are grateful to the physicians of our staff and to our employees for enduring the difficulties of the more than two years of construction.

Our orthopaedic specialization was greatly enhanced by a decision to place its leadership under a full-time director—Dr. Joseph Milgram took that post in April, 1953 and since his arrival has given force, unity and dedication to our program, which has, among other things, resulted in better teaching of students and better training of residents.

During the past year we have revolutionized our Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. It has been placed under the direction of Dr. Allen S. Russek. Highly trained specialists have been employed, inadequate routines discarded, improved and searching techniques are being developed. (A side result of these changes has been the elimination of much out-patient work which medical progress found to be without merit. This decrease in out-patient activity was complemented by a general decline in the need of such practice and a decision to minimize out-patient clinics in non-orthopaedic areas.)

Physical medicine is the handmaiden of ortho-

paediatric medicine, the inevitable and necessary follow-up, the ripening touch which may be required to assure the fruits of surgery. I feel that the combination of intense orthopaedic study, such as we now have, with the new approach to rehabilitation, gives promise of signal advances in the care of patients at the hospital and of significant contributions to orthopaedic science.

The Heinsheimer Country Home for Children in Rockaway was closed July 31, 1953 because tuberculosis of the bone, which had been the principal source of our chronic patients, has largely disappeared and because we wanted to have our child orthopaedic patients under the close supervision of our full orthopaedic staff. We have built a new Children's Wing on the sixth floor where we can do highly specialized work in this area. We have also made arrangements with the City schools for early referral to us of orthopaedic conditions so that there will be better possibilities of cure or improvement. I have great hopes that this new phase of work with children in the orthopaedic field will be very rewarding.

Our School of Practical Nursing which graduates about 85 students yearly, has greatly helped to fill our own needs and those of other hospitals in a field where there is a great scarcity of trained personnel. We should look to the idea of giving this school specialized, dynamic leadership so as to enhance its contribution as an educational institution.

Although the development of orthopaedic specialization has been our main concern, we have tried and, I think, succeeded in keeping other services up to a high standard of quality—in medicine, surgery and in the other specialized fields.

We have been able to institute a well-staffed department in Psychiatry during the past year under the leadership of Dr. Robert B. Miller, who was promoted to Attending in Psychiatry.

We are giving thought to the creation of an Institute of Basic Orthopaedic Research. Intensive study of the fundamental chemistry, pathology and mechanics in the field seems to be an obvious and necessary basis to the successful day-to-day practice of orthopaedic medicine and surgery.

During the past year the Hospital census continued at a high level. Our occupancy was 91 percent, which was again the highest of any voluntary hospital in the City.

Our Board now consists of 33 Trustees and one Honorary Trustee. During the past year we added two new members—Mr. Charles B. Benenson and Mr. Bernard Aronson, both of whom I am sure will contribute to the quality of our activities. I regret to report that during the past year

the Hospital lost an old and valued friend in the passing of the wife of Louis F. Rothschild, Honorary Treasurer of our Hospital.

I should like to express my gratitude to Oscar S. Rosner for his devotion and diligence to the Hospital as Chairman of the Board during the past year, and which was merely an extension of his service during previous years.

Later in this meeting you will hear from Mr. Willard E. Loeb, Treasurer of the Hospital and Chairman of the Finance Committee, who will report on the financial activities for the year. The Hospital deeply appreciates the devoted services of Mr. Loeb, who has been a Trustee of the Hospital for 27 years.

My personal thanks also go to the other officers of the Board—Messrs. Leopold Friedman, Alan H. Kempner and Herbert B. Langner, Vice-Presidents, to Gustave L. Levy, Secretary, and Herman D. Frauenthal, Assistant Treasurer. We are proud of the fact that Mr. Levy is the newly elected president of Federation of Jewish Philanthropies succeeding Mr. Salim Lewis who was also, as it happens, a member of our Board of Trustees. We regret the fact that this honor makes it necessary for Mr. Levy to terminate his membership on the Board here, though we are happy at Federation's gain of a valued leader.

No report such as this can chronicle the individual contributions of the members of the Board of Trustees but I do wish to record my thanks and appreciation to all the chairmen and members of the various committees for their devotion and effort throughout the year.

You will later hear from Dr. Louis Kleinfeld, Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board, who will report on the activities of the Medical Staff during the year. On behalf of the Board of Trustees I want to thank Dr. Kleinfeld and the entire medical staff for their splendid work.

My thanks are also due to Dr. Milgram, Director of Orthopaedics; Dr. Henry L. Jaffe, Director of our important Laboratory work and to his colleagues—Drs. Golden Selin, Jacob Kream and John E. Blair; to Dr. Allen S. Russek for rejuvenating the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation; and to Drs. Maurice M. Pomeranz, Milton Friedman and Sidney Rubinfeld for their accomplishments in the Radiology Department.

A number of changes occurred in the organization of the Medical Staff during the past year. Dr. Louis R. Davidson, Attending Thoracic Surgeon, was retired because of age and appointed Consultant Thoracic Surgeon. Dr. Emanuel B. Kaplan, Attending Orthopaedic Surgeon, was also retired

because of age and appointed Consultant in Orthopaedic Surgery. In view of Dr. Kaplan's unusual ability and interest in the Specialty of the Hand, he was granted permission to continue as Head of a Hand Service, a subspecialty of Orthopaedics. Three new Attendings were appointed by the Board: Dr. Barnard Kleiger, Associate Orthopaedic Surgeon, was promoted to Attending in Orthopaedic Surgery and Dr. Sidney A. Bernstein, an Alumnus and formerly on our Orthopaedic Staff, was also appointed Attending in Orthopaedic Surgery. I have already mentioned the appointments of Dr. Robert B. Miller as Attending in Psychiatry and Dr. Allen S. Russek in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation.

Miss Janice Seligman, Director of the Out-Patient Department, resigned from her post after serving our Hospital faithfully and well for 20 years. In her place, Miss Antonia Bernier, Assistant Director of the Out-Patient Department, who has been with our Hospital for 29 years, was promoted to the position of Director of the Out-Patient Department.

You will soon hear from Mrs. William Ullman, Chairman of the Women's Division, who will present a report on the past year's activities of the Women's Division. In accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Women's Division, Mrs. Ullman is retiring this month as its Chairman. The Hospital indeed owes a debt of gratitude to Mrs. Ullman, who has been a most competent and effective leader, and to the entire Women's Division which has worked so wholeheartedly for our institution in the many and diversified services the ladies render to the patients daily.

We acknowledge with great appreciation the cooperation we have received from the Bronx Hospital in our Student Nurses' Obstetrics Affiliation, and to the Jewish Hospital of Brooklyn for our affiliation in the Intern Program for Obstetrics. We are also thankful to Harlem, Morrisania and the Abraham Jacobi Hospitals in New York and the Central Dispensary and Emergency Hospital in Washington, D. C. for our exchange Residency Affiliation in Orthopedics, and to Columbia University for our affiliation programs in our post-graduate training courses, both in Orthopaedics and in Hospital Administration.

Again, as in past years, Federation of Jewish Philanthropies has been the largest single contributor toward our annual deficit. For those annual allotments, we are most thankful and, because it bears repetition, we acknowledge that without Federation's annual grants, our institution simply

could not function as it does. We also wish to acknowledge the generous annual financial support of the Greater New York Fund and the United Hospital Fund. We thank our good friends, the Lila Motley League, Mrs. Charles Kaye, the Summerfield Foundation, The Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, Dr. Percy Klingenstein, the Nathan Hofheimer Foundation, The Pearl Marrow Cancer Memorial and the many friends of the Hospital whose contributions will be listed in detail in our Annual Report.

It also gives me great pleasure at this time to express not only my own but the Trustees' appreciation to Dr. Samuel J. Gelman, Assistant Director and to all of the Department Heads of the Hospital: Miss Sadie Shapiro, Miss Phyllis Blaine, Miss Justine Hannan, Mr. George L. Finch, Mr. Max Huttner, Mr. Simon Schapiro, Miss Antonia Bernier, Miss Frances Zahler, Miss Amelia Mater, Mr. A. Jenan, Mr. Paul Illes, Mrs. Marie Truglio, Mrs. Rika L. Hopkins, Mrs. Elizabeth Styres; to all the members of the administrative staff and the 600 employees of the Hospital go our deepest thanks and appreciation for a job well done every day of the year.

Perhaps my most heartfelt tribute comes at this point because it is a summing up of all the other jobs which have to be well done to create a properly operated hospital. All of these activities can be personalized in the contribution of our Director—Mr. Abraham Rosenberg—who has carried the responsibility for the operation of the Hospital and done so with rare ability and poise. An indication of his quality, and only one indication, is in the fact that, as already mentioned, during this difficult period of construction the Hospital was able to carry on its activities without interruption of service and without loss of income.

The Fiftieth Anniversary of the founding of the Hospital was celebrated in November of 1956. On the scientific side the Hospital was host to many distinguished physicians and scientists from other hospitals and medical schools and to the Alumni of the Hospital who attended from every part of the country. Dr. Samuel Kleinberg, Editor of the Hospital's Scientific Bulletin, published a special anniversary issue commemorating the fifty years of scientific and medical activities of the Hospital. A dinner was given at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel attended by over 800 persons. Speakers included Dr. Detlev W. Bronk, President of the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research, Mr. Salim Lewis, President of Federation, and representatives of community and medical agencies of which the Hospital is a part.

In conclusion may I thank you for the opportunity I have been given to serve as your President during the past five years. Behind us lie fifty years of pioneering work in orthopaedic surgery and in the development of a hospital with a wide range of collateral services. The future I believe holds

great promise of ever improving medical service to the community and significant contributions to medicine, to hospital practice, and to science.

AS CHAIRMAN of the Medical Advisory Board, it is my privilege to report on the activities of the Professional Staff of the Hospital for Joint Diseases during 1956, our 50th Anniversary Year.

#### BUILDING PROGRAM

The completion of our new building program this year has vastly benefited the professional activities of the Hospital. In this connection, an unbelievably smooth transition period during the actual construction, may be credited to the unfailing cooperation of both the lay and professional personnel.

#### ORTHOPAEDIC SURGERY

The further orientation of the Hospital toward Orthopaedics has been aided by the appointment of a total of six Orthopaedic Attending Surgeons. Ultimately there will be an Attending Orthopaedic Surgeon on Service at all times, even during vacation months. In the new children's pavilion, which was opened in September, the rooms and wards for children were designed in size and equipment to cope with the problems of the future. Special attention is being given to the Children's Orthopaedic Service and liaison has been established by means of numerous meetings in the Hospital, with local School Boards, Parent-Teacher Associations, the Board of Education and the Department of Health. In connection with this, Dr. Joseph E. Milgram was interviewed by Mr. Arthur Van Horn on a radio broadcast over WABC in March, 1956.

In order to facilitate special care, the Foot Clinic was elevated to a Foot Service under Dr. Paul Lapidus, Associate Orthopaedic Surgeon; the Hand Clinic was expanded to a Hand Service under Dr. Emanuel B. Kaplan, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon; and a new Scoliosis Clinic was established under Dr. Jacob J. Graham, Adjunct Orthopaedic Surgeon.

An innovation was the completion of the rules governing the assignment of insurance and compensation-covered ward cases, particularly on the Orthopaedic Services.

Worthy of note is the fact that out of the 128 non-Government Orthopaedic Hospitals in the country, the Hospital for Joint Diseases treated the fourth largest number of In-Patients.

#### DISASTER PLAN

An important contribution was made by Dr.

Albert M. Betcher, Attending Anesthesiologist, in the drawing up of a carefully planned and detailed Manual for the handling of mass disasters. Copies of this "Disaster" plan were distributed to all concerned throughout the Hospital.

Dr. Allen S. Russek, Director, Department of Rehabilitation and Physical Medicine.

Dr. Sidney A. Bernstein, Attending Orthopaedic Surgeon.

Dr. Barnard Kleiger, Attending Orthopaedic Surgeon, promoted from Associate Orthopaedic Surgeon.

Dr. Robert B. Miller, Attending Psychiatrist, promoted from Associate Psychiatrist.

#### REHABILITATION AND PHYSICAL MEDICINE

Under the leadership of Dr. Allen S. Russek and with the invaluable help of Miss Sadie Shapiro, there has been further development of the Rehabilitation Service. Much credit is due to Drs. Barnard Kleiger and Howard Balensweig for their devoted work with this program, in cooperation with the New York State Board of Vocational Rehabilitation.

Affiliation with the New York University-Bellevue Rehabilitation Center has been established for training of residents in this field. Also under Dr. Russek, the Physical Medicine Service has been expanded to afford more detailed attention to both In-Patients and Out-Patients.

#### 50TH ANNIVERSARY

The 50th Anniversary of the Hospital was marked by an excellent Scientific Program, a special issue of the Scientific Bulletin, and by a gala dinner at the Waldorf Astoria. Mr. Oscar S. Rosner, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, was the overall coordinator of the Anniversary celebration. Dr. William M. Unobskey was the Chairman of the dinner committee. The success of the scientific session was the result of the concerted efforts of the Scientific Research and Teaching Committee, Dr.

Henry L. Jaffe, Chairman, and the Alumni Association, Dr. Charles J. Sutro, President.

Special mention must be made of Dr. Samuel Kleinberg for his inspiring and successful editorship of the Hospital for Joint Diseases' Bulletin for the past sixteen years, and especially for the particularly fine 50th Anniversary Issue.

#### OBITUARY

We mourn the loss of Dr. Violet de Beck, Adjunct in General Medicine, who was the wife of Dr. Albert A. Epstein, Consultant in Medicine. She had given devoted service to the Hospital for Joint Diseases for twenty-five years.

#### SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITIES

Elsewhere in this 50th Annual Report of the Hospital, will be found lists of lectures given here by distinguished visitors; lectures given outside the Hospital by our own Staff; publications, research projects, and exhibits resulting from the efforts of our Staff; honors conferred upon the Attending Staff, and courses given by them. May we earnestly urge you to peruse those lists which comprise the concrete results and noteworthy achievements in medical science, wrought by the dedicated efforts of members of our Staff. Outstanding among the honors, was the scientific award given to Dr. Henry L. Jaffe by the New York University Medical Alumni Association, for his valuable contributions in skeletal disease entities.

#### MEDICAL ADVISORY BOARD

The members of the Medical Advisory Board and the Conference Committee on Medical Matters (the Executive Committee) deserve great credit for their untiring attendance at many lengthy meetings and for their careful consideration of the numerous problems presented there. The work of all the special and standing committees of the Medical Advisory Board has been noteworthy and productive of important results with regard to improved patient care, as well as more effective resident, intern and nurses' training programs.

New procedures are being introduced for the benefit of all our patients. These include chest x-rays on admission of all patients and routine dental consultations on all service patients. Moreover, psychosomatic factors in patient care are being emphasized at regular joint meetings of the House Staff and the Psychiatric Service. A vast improvement in the keeping of records is due to efforts of the Library and Record Committee, Dr. Milton Kramer, Chairman, particularly the introduction of the unit system of combining all Out-Patient and In-Patient records.

The House Staff, under Dr. Albert M. Betcher,

successfully handled the involved problem concerning the selection and training of the House Staff. We are very proud that, for this year, the entire House Staff is coming to us through the Matching Plan.

The Hospital has given the members of the House Staff protection against legal complications by taking out malpractice insurance for them.

The Tissue Committee, Dr. Benjamin N. Berg, Chairman, has met regularly each month and devoted much time to reviewing diagnoses and operative findings of all patients' records. This Committee has served the Hospital well throughout the year in analyzing and evaluating all medical and surgical procedures.

The Operating Room Committee, Dr. Percy Klingenstein, Chairman, has done a vast amount of work in order to solve the complicated details of the functioning of the Operating Room Suite and the Recovery Room.

The Nursing and Dietetics Committee, Dr. H. Evans Leiter, Chairman, carefully considered and planned further improvements in the vital problems relating to dietetics and to the training and developing of the Nursing Staff.

The Alumni Association, under the leadership of Dr. Charles J. Sutro, and the Junior Medical Board, led by Dr. Robert Nach, have been especially active and constructive during the past year.

The Clinical Society, Dr. Edward Jacobs, Chairman, had a number of valuable meetings. These are particularly important because the Joint Commission on Accreditation considers well attended Staff meetings of vital importance to the Hospital.

#### BY-LAWS

After very careful consideration, the Constitution and the By-Laws of the MAB were revised and amended in order to be in complete accord with the requirements of the Joint Commission on Accreditation, which has consistently placed the Hospital on its fully approved Accredited list.

#### OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT

The Out-Patient Department has decreased its heavy case load by making all the Services, except Orthopaedics, Pediatrics, Medicine and Surgery, function as Consulting Services only.

It is with regret that the Cancer Detection and Prevention Center had to be closed because adequate outside financial support to make this a self-supporting project was not forthcoming.

#### APPRECIATION

As a token of appreciation to all physicians no longer on active duty, but who have given service

to the Hospital for fifteen years or more, certificates will be issued.

It is with great pleasure that I take this opportunity to give sincere thanks to those, without whose cooperation the work of the Hospital could not have gone forward this year: to the Board of Trustees, Mr. Raphael Malsin, President; to our devoted Executive Director, Mr. Abraham Rosenberg; and to Dr. Samuel Gelman, our Assistant Director.

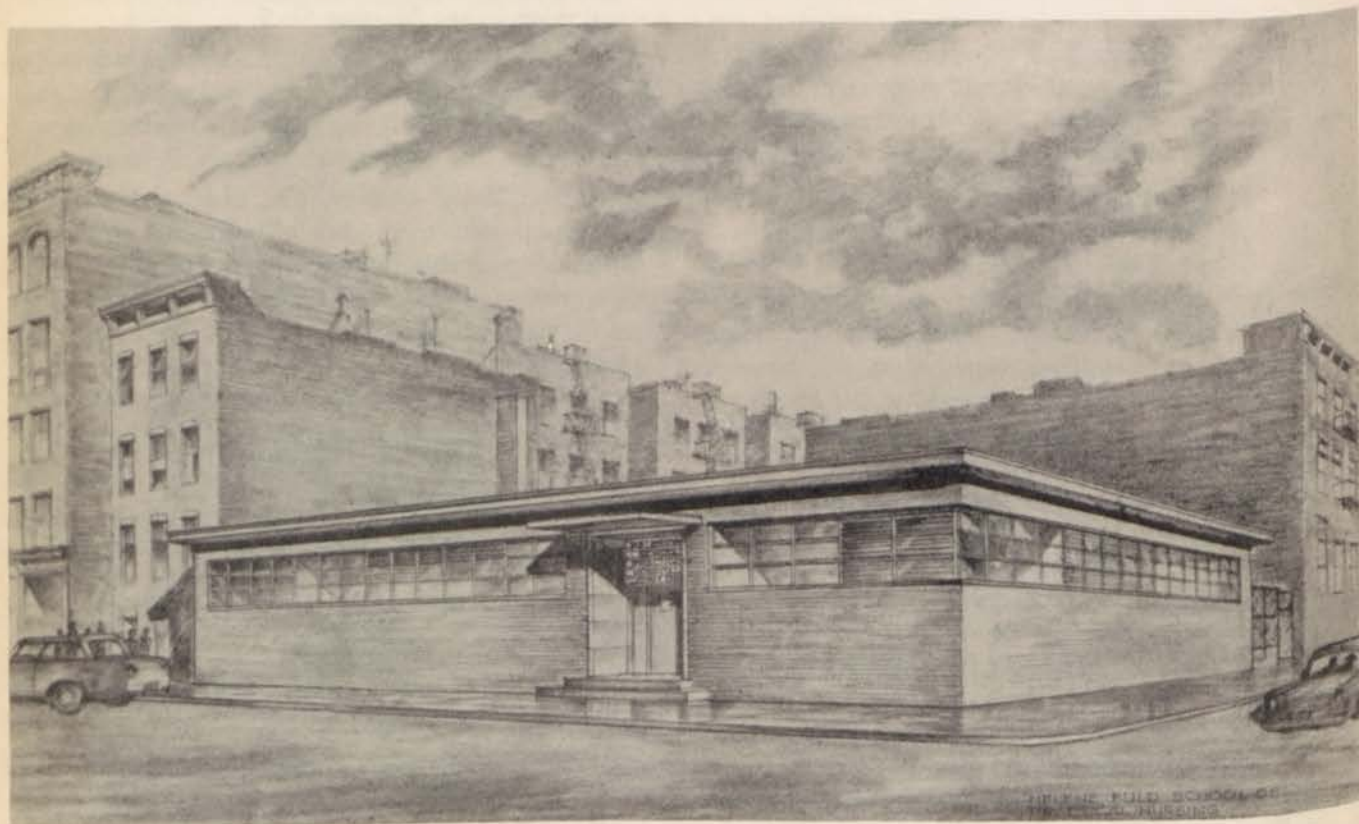

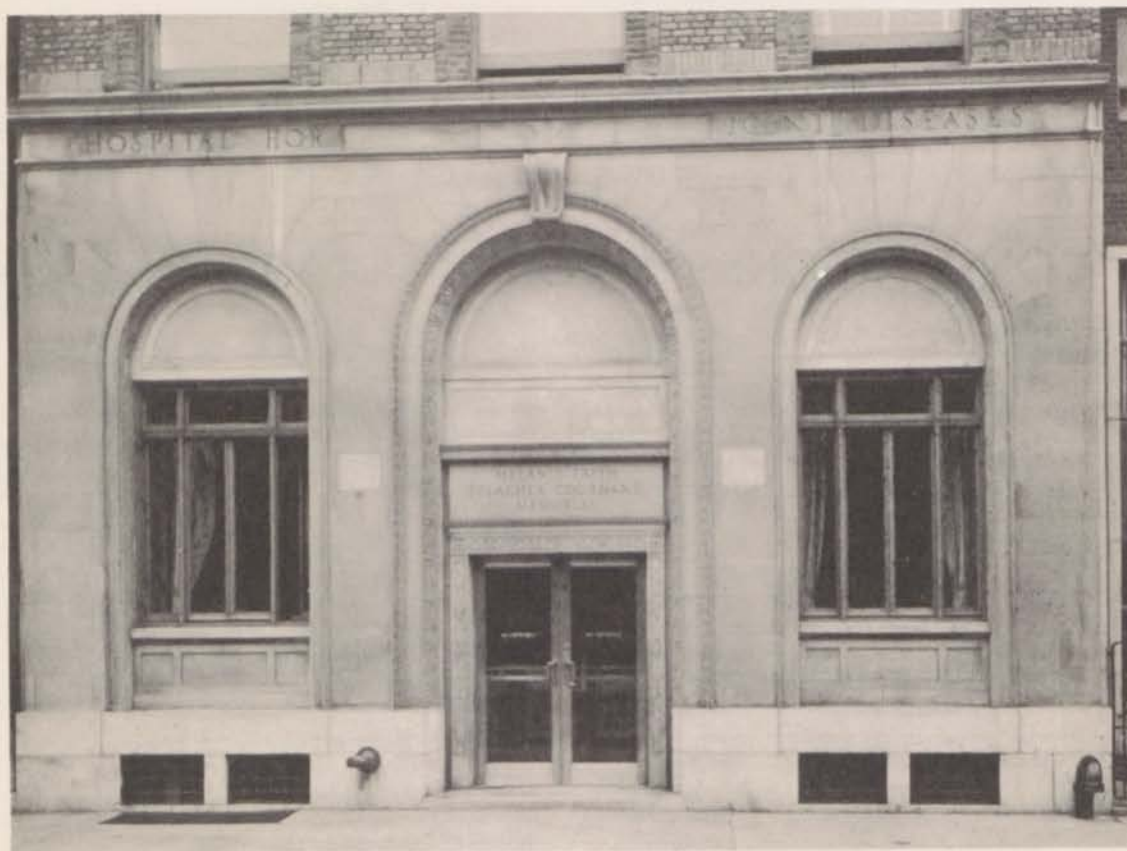

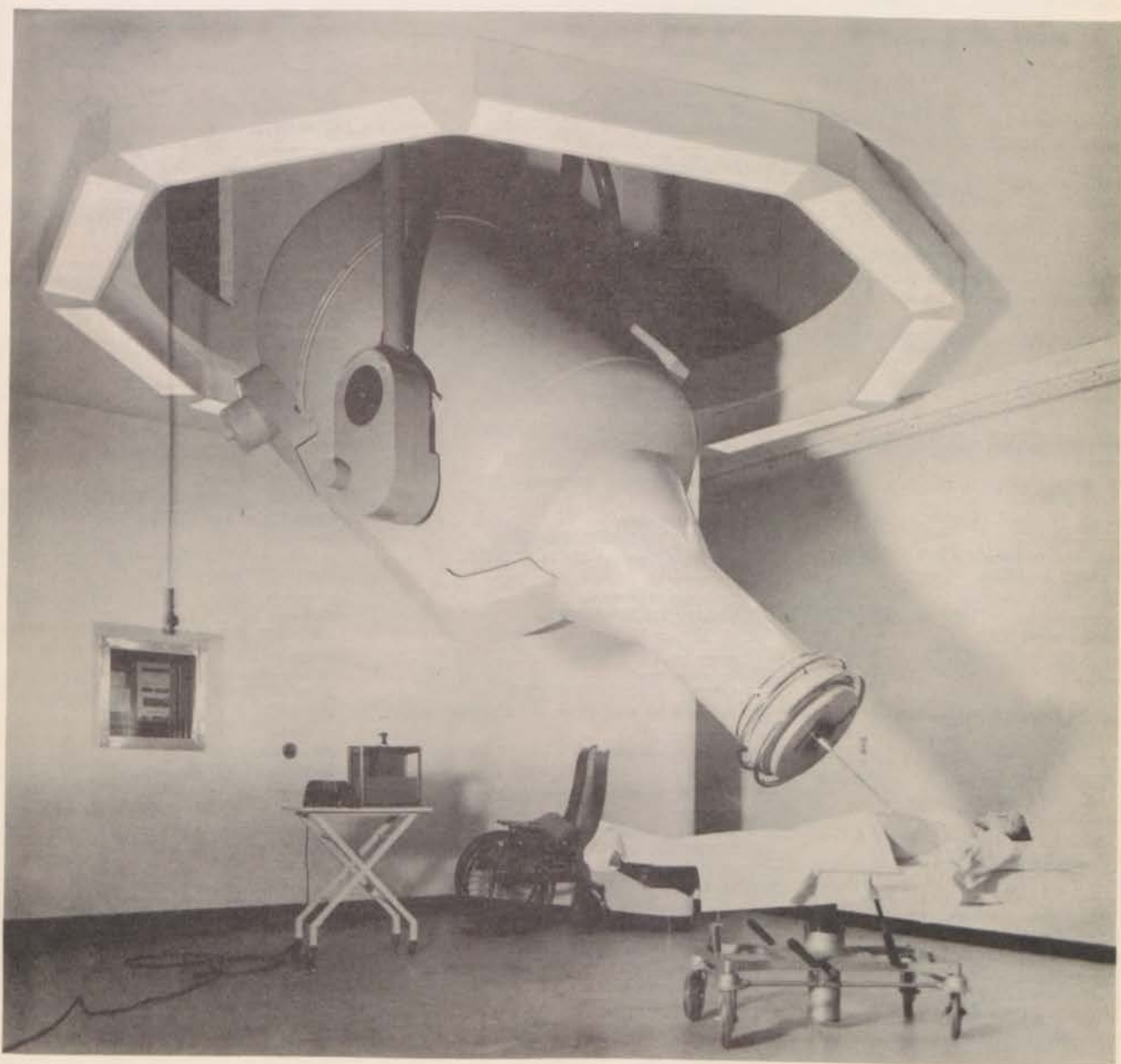

## CHAIRMAN OF THE WOMEN'S DIVISION

FOR THE YEAR 1956

THE YEAR 1956 was a fruitful one for the Women's Division. Several new services were instituted and others which became obsolete, were discontinued. We have consolidated our activities rather than cover too many areas and now have a taut and smooth-running organization.

Our two fund-raising drives were successful and great credit is due those chairmen who put much effort into a difficult job.

Mrs. Seymour Klein reports the following figures raised for the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies—102 items amounting to \$8,815. Without Mrs. Klein's fine spirit and guidance we would not have such splendid figures to report.

Mrs. Henry Nordlinger and Mrs. Milton Steiner, Co-Chairmen of the United Hospital Fund Committee, raised \$16,546. This committee is always productive and thanks are certainly due them, as well as, to Mrs. Harry Zucker, Chairman of Box Week.

**GIFT SHOP:** On Tuesday, March 16, the Women's Division opened its new Gift Shop under the leadership of Mrs. Leopold Stern. For two years, a gift cart had successfully serviced the Hospital three times weekly, but with the advent of the Shop, situated in the main lobby, Mrs. Stern and her committee realized a dream come true. The shop is staffed by Volunteers and two professional managers, one full time and one for weekends. Too much credit cannot be given Mrs. Stern and her committee, for these ladies work tirelessly, enthusiastically and loyally both in merchandising and in selling. From January 1, 1956 to January 1, 1957 the cart and Gift Shop have sold \$15,331.13 worth of merchandise with a gross profit of \$4,163.41 and a net profit of \$1,214.85. This sum is given to the Women's Division Special Projects Fund.

Mrs. Seymour Klein, Chairman of *Occupational Therapy*, gives the following report: The Occupational Therapy department is very fortunate in having Volunteers who are both loyal and efficient. Two-thirds of our Volunteers have worked in the department for more than three years. While the Occupational Therapy Volunteer's job is interesting and stimulating, it is also a physically and mentally demanding job. It requires training, a background of varied skills, physical stamina, and

an outgoing personality. The chairman wishes to thank the Volunteers for their very great contribution to the welfare of the patients in the Hospital: In turn, the Volunteers wish to thank Miss Moeller, Mrs. Gordon and Mrs. Zone, the Occupational Therapists for their invaluable direction and assistance.

Statistically speaking, there were five Volunteers who worked on the wards a total of 547 hours: one Volunteer in the children's recreation who gave 96 hours, and two Volunteers with a total of 191¼ hours spent on administrative duties in the Hospital.

Mrs. Karl Leubsdorf continued as Chairman of the Library and happily reports the smooth functioning of her committee. During the year, with the help of six loyal Volunteers, the entire Hospital and Staff were serviced once a week, with special requests filled twice weekly. During last summer, the book cart rolled for the first time due to the devotion and cooperation of Mrs. Leonard Herzig and Miss Irene MacFarland. With the opening of the new children's floor, regular service to them was reinstated. It is most interesting (statistically) to note the following figures for 1956: 14.7 books and 20 magazines per Hospital bed.

**RECREATION:** The Recreation Program continues under Mrs. William Biel's able leadership and Mrs. Elizabeth Styres as Recreational Director. Evening recreation still functions on the wards three times a week, consisting of moving pictures, bingo and musical entertainment. The outstanding new feature in the Recreation Department is Music Therapy instituted by Miss Barbara Dinell and Mrs. Elizabeth Styres. Several Volunteers give classes in piano and guitar-playing. The Turtle Bay Music School sent a group to observe these classes and praised this unusual service to the patient's well-being.

In the past year our adult wards observed Chanukah for the first time through the interest of Mrs. Martin DeGraaff. The Committee also sponsored a Christmas Party and gifts were given to each ward patient.

The Volunteer Office to date has enjoyed its most successful year under the direction of Mrs. Elizabeth Styres and Mrs. Leon Dinell and rates 4th highest out of 23 hospitals with bed comple-

ment 200-400. We have had during the year 235 working Volunteers completing 15,825½ hours. United Hospital Fund Awards will be given to 33 Volunteers.

Our services have expanded to a well manned Gift Shop, Hostesses, Floaters, Information Desk, Music, Recreation, Telephone Operators in Operating Theatre, besides our regular services in the Library, Occupational Therapy, Central Supply, Linen Room, Admitting Office, Pediatrics and Nurses Aides.

The Volunteer Office would like to give special mention to Mrs. Lillienthal, Director of Volunteer Services at Federation. She has been more than generous in selecting our Hospital to absorb many valuable men and women who are willing to do their share in our community.

The new Volunteer Office has been able to function more efficiently due to the services of a part-time secretary—and in addition, we have received as a gift, a duplicator machine through the generosity of Mrs. Samuel Levy and Mrs. Henry Nordlinger. We also have a lounge for Volunteers where they can have tea and coffee. The patients taking Piano from a Volunteer teacher can have their lessons and practice in the lounge.

Also thanks are expressed to The United Hospital Fund, The Central Volunteer Bureau of New York, to Mrs. Gaines' Home Nursing and, last but not least, to our own members who have so greatly helped in swelling the Volunteer ranks.

A separate committee for the Social Service Department of the Hospital has been absorbed into the Social Service Committee of the Board of

Trustees. This change has integrated the three committees formerly functioning under the Women's Committee, Medical Board and Board of Trustees. However, it is to be noted that the Director of Social Services regularly discusses some of the problems of the department with former members of the committee of the Women's Division. The former members also attend meetings in the community and often represent the department at such meetings. In addition to this, the Women's Division continues to run an efficient program on the children's wards under the Chairmanship of Mrs. Gerald Norwood.

Speaking for the whole Women's Division, I should like to express the sincerest thanks to Mr. Raphael Malsin, President of the Hospital, to the Board of Trustees, to Mr. Abraham Rosenberg, Executive Director, Dr. Samuel Gelman, Assistant Director and thanks also to the entire Professional Staff. The acceptance of our activities and the inevitable problems arising therefrom, have always been met by an open door, an understanding ear and excellent advice.

As my four years as Chairman of the Women's Division draw to a close, I wish to give personal thanks to everyone and to say that I have enjoyed a wealth of experience in both tangibles and intangibles. To Bertha Leubsdorf, our next Chairman, I pledge my complete support and want to assure her of the faith we all have in a bigger and better Women's Division under her able leadership.
